

Summer is here and I am extremely happy to announce that the students have successfully completed their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award! So what have they been up to?



May 2016 saw the pupils complete their Bronze AND Silver Indoor Climbing Awards with Wolf Mountain to finally complete their 6 month Physical section. The pupils were put through their final assessments which included an independent climb, a group climb and rope work. However the toughest section of the award was still to come... the EXPEDITION!

During June 2016, the group took to the hills and valleys of the Derbyshire Peak District and completed two weekends of walking, navigating themselves around 28km of open countryside. The assessment expedition was a massive success, seeing the group not only complete their planned route, but deal with torrential rain, boggy marshland and a cold night in a tent. The group's aim was 'teamwork', and their assessor was extremely proud to say the least. It was especially impressive to see how the pupils stuck together and made decisions as a group in tough conditions. This was the first time the Duke of Edinburgh Award has come to The Hollies, and this group of pupils have set a bench mark for future pupils. Their determination to succeed was clear from day one, and over the last 7 months I have watched them grow: developing new skills, pushing themselves out of their comfort zones, but most importantly, become ambassadors of the school and role models for future candidates.

I look forward to continuing this great Award next year with future pupils at the Hollies, and would like

to take this opportunity to again thank the group. I wish huge congratulations to Callum, Caolan and Dana for completing their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award. I am sure they have made many memories which will stay with them for the next stage in their journey.
